***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

With the aid of License Plate Recognition Cameras, officers identified a vehicle involved in criminal activity in Ferguson, Missouri. This vehicle was later located in the parking lot of St. Clair Square, where officers carried out a procedure, commonly referred to as a high-risk vehicle stop, to manage the situation safely. During this procedure, officers were prepared with their standard-issue firearms drawn to ensure control and

safety. Working in collaboration with the Ferguson Police Department, the team involved requested the identification of the individuals in the vehicle and took photographs of the vehicle to assist in the ongoing investigation.

An officer identified a vehicle in the St. Clair Square Parking Lot that was sought in connection with serious criminal charges from Missouri. Upon observing the vehicle, one adult and two minors were observed approaching it. Law enforcement then executed a procedure, known as a high-risk vehicle stop, during which they were prepared with their standard-issue firearms drawn to ensure the situation remained under control. The investigation revealed the adult was carrying a loaded Glock firearm, and an AR-15-style pistol was found within the vehicle. Following these discoveries, charges were brought against the individuals for illegal weapon possession.

During a traffic stop, officers discovered the driver had existing warrants for his arrest. The driver was apprehended without any complications. However, the passenger refused to provide identifying information after the officer established probable cause that he violated a traffic law. Ultimately, the passenger was taken into custody, but not after refusing to adhere to officers' instructions to vacate the vehicle. During the exchange, an officer aimed a Taser at the individual, which led to compliance. Despite this, the passenger later resisted the standard booking procedures and had to be restrained once more. Following these events, the individual reported experiencing discomfort in the wrist area.
