***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

Officers conducted a traffic stop for a minor violation and determined the driver had active warrants for their arrest. Officers provided verbal commands for the subject to exit the vehicle to which the subject refused. Officers, in order to affect the arrest, physically pulled the subject from the vehicle as they continued to resist. The subject was ultimately taken into custody and charged with resisting arrest, DUI, and possession of controlled substance. No injuries were sustained by the officers or subject.

Officer observed a subject walking upon the highway, a violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code, and conducted a pedestrian check. The officer attempted to identify the subject who refused to provide any information. The subject was informed he was under arrest for Obstructing a Peace Officer. Upon attempting to place him in handcuffs, the subject pulled his arms away and towards the center-line of his body. Officer conducted a leg take down, pinning the subject to the ground and securing him in handcuffs. The subject was thusly charged with Obstructing a Peace Officer.

Officer observed a pedestrian walking crossing the highway outside of a designated crosswalk, in violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code. The officer had to apply the brakes to avoid striking the subject and when the officers attempted to contact the offender, he fled on foot through yards. Another officer encountered the subject running across another roadway and this officer pointed his taser at the subject and ordered him to stop. The subject complied with the order and was arrested. The subject was charged with Obstructing a Peace Officer.

Officers responded to a domestic battery report where the caller reported the suspect had immediate access to a handgun and was reaching for it. While knocking on the front door of the house, officers heard a physical disturbance on the other side of the door. The door came open and the officers ordered the subject out of the house at gunpoint. The subject was compliant and followed

the officer's orders. Charges against the suspect for Domestic Battery are still pending at the State's Attorney's Office.

Officers were called to a business regarding a disorderly subject who was screaming and cursing in front of the business. Officers encountered the male, knowing him from prior contacts. The male had previously been trespassed from the business and had active warrants for his arrest. The subject physically resisted the initial arrest attempt and was taken to the ground by officers to limit his ability to physically resist. Once on the ground the suspect scratched and clawed with his fingernails at an officer's face, causing minor injuries. The subject was charged with Aggravated Battery to a Peace Officer, Criminal Trespass, Disorderly Conduct, Obstructing a Peace Officer and served with warrants for possession of drug paraphernalia.

Officers responded to a business for a report of a theft. The subject battered an employee that suffered from developmental delays, then fled the store. The subject was located in a nearby neighborhood by officers and he resisted arrest. Family members of the subject arrived on-scene and also interfered with the arrest. The subject was taken into custody and once back at the FHPD he was non-compliant with booking procedures and turned in aggressive manner towards an officer, placing that officer in fear of being battered. In response, the officer pushed the subject against the wall to restrict his movements. The subject was charged with Aggravated Battery (against store employee), Retail Theft and Resisting Arrest.

An officer located a stolen vehicle on a parking lot. The officer drew his pistol and kept it in a low ready position as he ordered the subject out of the vehicle. The subject was taken into custody and the case was turned over to the Metro East Auto Theft Task Force.
