***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

Officers responded to a motel for a report of a domestic battery. The male subject tensed up and pulled his arms away when officers attempted to arrest him. A knee strike was delivered to the suspect's thigh, which caused him to fall and be taken into handcuffs without further incident. The suspect was charged with Domestic Battery and Resisting a Peace Officer.

Officers responded to the Metrolink for a disorderly male who had defecated in public. Officers encountered the male, who was verbally hostile. When the officers went to arrest him for Disorderly Conduct and Trespassing (he was refusing to leave the property), the male tensed up and pulled away. Officers took the suspect to the ground and secured him in handcuffs.

Officers were called to a gas station after the male from 26-00685 was released from FHPD custody and causing a disturbance. The male was threatening customers and employees inside of the gas station as well as officers when they arrived on-scene. As the male was walking away an Officer took him by the arms and he tensed up and attempted to pull-away. The male was again taken to the ground and secured in handcuffs.

Officers were assisting Shiloh PD with a Domestic Battery where the suspect had fled in a vehicle from responding units and O'Fallon PD. An FHPD Officer encountered the suspect walking in FH after abandoning his vehicle. The suspect was ordered to the ground and after initially refusing, he complied after the officer drew his taser and pointed it at the male.

Officers responded to a theft at the mall. An officer spotted the suspect running away across the parking lot. The Officer approached the male suspect and drew his Taser, pointing it at the suspect and ordering him to the ground. The suspect complied, and was apprehended without further incident.

Officers responded to a fast-food restaurant for reports of a male armed with a handgun, threatening to shoot another person. Officers arrived and drew their service pistols as they issued commands to the subject, who complied. The male was arrested for Disorderly Conduct. Officers were responding to a report of a Homicide when they encountered the suspect leaving the area. The suspect reportedly used a handgun to commit the murder. Officers drew their pistols and issued commands to the suspect, taking him into custody without incident.

An officer was at Belleville Memorial Hospital when he was flagged down by security guards for assistance with a combative male. The male suspect began trying to physically batter the security guards and the Officer intervened and took the suspect to the ground. He was detained until Belleville PD arrived and took over. The officer sustained a scratch to his elbow.

Officers responded to the French Village Motel to search for an Agg Domestic Battery suspect. The male suspect was encountered in a motel room and when officers tried to arrest him, he pulled away and then was taken to the ground and secured into handcuffs.
