***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

An officer responded to a domestic disturbance call and encountered three highly agitated individuals. During the investigation, officers discovered that one of the participants was wanted on multiple domestic assault warrants issued in the State of Kansas. When officers attempted to arrest this individual, she resisted by pulling away and kicking at them. To manage the situation, officers placed her on the ground and secured her with handcuffs. As a result, she was charged with Resisting a Peace Officer in addition to facing the outstanding warrants. No injuries.

Officers responded to an incident at Olive Garden where a report indicated a subject had pointed a gun at an employee. Before police arrived, the subject had fled on foot into a wooded area behind the Super 8 Motel. A K9 officer was called to the scene and successfully located the subject, who then surrendered without resistance. To ensure safety and control during the detention, officers displayed their firearms and Tasers. It was later determined the weapon was an Airsoft-style gun.

Officers were dispatched to a local car wash at 4:30 in the morning following a report of a suspicious individual looking into car windows in the parking lot. Upon arrival, officers discovered a subject hiding inside one of the vehicles. To manage the situation, officers displayed their firearms, and the individual was taken into custody without incident. The person was subsequently charged with Criminal Trespass to a Motor Vehicle.

An officer responded to an apartment building following a report of an ongoing domestic battery incident. Upon arrival, one of the officers observed an intoxicated individual in the parking lot attempting to enter the driver's seat of a nearby vehicle. The officer instructed the individual to stop and took the car keys from his hand. When the individual attempted to walk away, the officer instructed him to remain, believing he was connected to the domestic incident, and proceeded to detain him. The individual resisted by pushing the officer's hands away when the officer tried to grab his arm. The officer then tripped the individual, bringing him to the ground, and secured him with handcuffs. The individual was subsequently charged with Domestic Battery and Obstructing a Peace Officer. No injuries.

While monitoring radio communications from nearby departments, an officer identified a motorcycle on Ludwig Drive that was wanted for Aggravated Fleeing and Eluding. The officer conducted a vehicle stop and, due to the seriousness of the offense, employed high-risk vehicle stop tactics to take the individual into custody. These tactics involved displaying a firearm to ensure control and safety during the detention. The subject was subsequently transferred to a neighboring agency for formal charges.

Officers were conducting self-initiated field work in the vicinity of the French Village Motel when they identified an individual residing in a cabin with an outstanding parole violation warrant from Missouri. Upon making contact, the individual refused to open the cabin door. Officers gained entry and, employing high-risk patrol operation tactics, displayed both Tasers and firearms. Despite this, the individual refused to comply with commands to lay down. Officers had to physically push the individual to the floor to gain control. The subject then hid his arms and hands beneath his body to avoid being handcuffed. After several commands to place his hands behind his back, an officer used a pain-compliance technique called a drive stun, which delivers a localized neuro-muscular disruption via the Taser. The subject immediately complied and was taken into custody. No injuries. He was subsequently transferred to the St. Clair County Jail, awaiting extradition to Missouri.

An officer responded to a medical call at the Metrolink when a Metro security guard approached and indicated a subject walking through the parking lot who had threatened to strike him. The officer observed the subject was carrying a large metal pipe. To ensure safety, the officer approached the subject with his firearm displayed. The subject complied with all commands and was detained for the offense of Aggravated Assault.
