***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

An officer was confronted at a red light by a subject that appeared to be highly agitated. The officer knew this individual because the department frequently contacts the subject for public disorder incidents. The individual was blocking the roadway and was told to continue to drive by the officer. The subject followed the police vehicle to a nearby parking lot, where the officer attempted to speak to the individual. It appeared the subject was experiencing a mental health crisis. The officer discovered the subject had an active warrant through St. Clair County. Based on the subject's prior tendency to resist arrest, officers displayed their department-issued Tasers to gain compliance. The subject complied and was taken into custody. No injuries.

Officers conducted a traffic stop in the area of Chateau Drive. After being lawfully detained, the vehicle's passenger was instructed to remain in the vehicle multiple times. The subject continued to exit the vehicle and

was ultimately arrested for Obstructing a Peace Officer. The subject complained of pain in his wrist from handcuffing. No visible injuries.

Officers assisted the O'Fallon Police Department with a high-risk vehicle stop on a vehicle that had stolen license plates. The officers displayed their firearms at the low ready, pointed at the ground, while directing the occupants to exit the vehicle. The vehicle's occupants were detained and returned to the O'Fallon Police Department for further investigation. No injuries.

Officers were dispatched to a domestic in progress, and upon arrival, the female involved party explained her son got upset and threw a fan, breaking a window in the house. The officer searched for the subject in the home and discovered him hiding behind a couch in the garage. The subject was verbally defiant refusing orders. Officers pointed their department-issued Tasers at the subject, who became compliant and was taken into custody. The subject was subsequently charged with Criminal Damage to Property. No Injuries.

Officers were dispatched to a disorderly subject kicking the residential door belonging to an ex-girlfriend. Upon arrival, officers attempted to make contact with the subject. The subject ignored the officers and walked away. After multiple commands for the subject to stop, an officer displayed his Taser, attempting to gain compliance. The subject ultimately stopped and was handcuffed. The subject resisted walking to the patrol vehicle and complained about his handcuffs being too tight. The handcuffs were checked multiple times by multiple officers. Ultimately, the subject was charged with Obstructing a Peace Officer and Resisting Arrest. No injuries.

An officer was dispatched to a fight at a retail store parking lot. It was reported to the officers that one of the subjects was armed with a knife, got into a car, and fled from the scene. A responding officer located the vehicle and conducted a high-risk vehicle stop with his firearm displayed. The subject was detained during the investigation. It was determined that all parties engaged in a fight due to the belief the subject cut into the drive-thru line. No injuries.

Officers responded to a protest of thirty people dangerously blocking multiple streets. The protest was because of an incident almost two hours north of our city. Protestors were ordered onto the sidewalk numerous times and refused. Because of the danger to the public and the protestors the main organizer was moved onto the sidewalk by pushing. He refused, spun around and attempted to re-enter the street and was arrested. No injuries.
