***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

Officers responded to a disturbance at a local hotel where the owner requested assistance in removing a guest involved in a physical altercation with another patron. The guest, who appeared highly intoxicated, refused to gather his belongings and leave the premises. Subsequently, he was arrested for disorderly conduct. Despite being handcuffed, the individual passively resisted by refusing to walk to the squad car, requiring officers to carry him to the vehicle. Upon arrival at the police station, he continued to resist, refusing to be searched and enter a cell. Officers had to repeatedly lift him to place him in the cell. During one attempt to secure the cell door, the individual placed his hand in the doorjamb, resulting in his hand being caught. No injury was reported. After sobering up, the subject was released with a citation.

Officers were dispatched to a local business following a report of a father abducting his child and fleeing the scene. The officers located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. When the driver refused multiple requests to exit the vehicle, officers eventually persuaded him to comply, though he resisted being handcuffed. Backup officers displayed a Taser and warned the individual of its potential use if he continued to resist. The individual then reluctantly complied and was handcuffed. Later, the individual complained of pain and numbness in his left thumb due to the handcuffs. He was subsequently charged with child abduction, obstructing and resisting a peace officer, and possession of cannabis with intent to distribute.

Officers responded to the scene of a hit-and-run incident and initiated a search for the suspect vehicle. After a thorough search, they located a vehicle matching the description approximately half a mile away in the parking lot of Target. Upon approaching the driver, officers observed clear signs of alcohol intoxication. The driver was subsequently arrested and transported to the police station. During the transport, the suspect managed to slip out of her handcuffs and struck the arresting officer in the neck. Officers then restrained her by bringing her to the ground and placing her in a restraint chair, a device designed to limit movement and prevent individuals from harming themselves or others. No injuries to the suspect.

Officers responded to a report of a burglar alarm at a local church. Upon arrival, the officer discovered a partially open window and observed dirty footprints inside the building. A perimeter was established, and after a brief period, an individual emerged from the window. Officers, with weapons drawn, apprehended the suspect following the issuance of verbal commands. The subject was taken into custody without incident and no injuries.

Officers responded to a report of a theft in progress at a store, involving a subject previously involved in a theft at the same location. Although the individual was not stealing during this visit, they were identified as a fugitive with an outstanding traffic warrant. When the suspect resisted being handcuffed, officers brought her to the ground and restrained her until additional officers arrived to assist in the arrest. No injuries other than a bruise on the officer.

Officers responded to a report of a domestic-related home invasion where a female victim was assaulted by her ex-boyfriend, who was reported to be armed. The suspect fled the scene before police arrived. After several hours, officers located the suspect using GPS data from a stolen phone. The suspect was cornered in a 24-hour laundromat, where he attempted to flee. Officers deployed a Taser, but it was ineffective. Despite this, officers were able to take the suspect to the ground and handcuff him. No injuries.

Officers observed a suspect linked to several attempted burglaries in District 2. Upon making contact, the suspect refused to comply with instructions to stand up for handcuffing. An officer administered a wrist lock, prompting the suspect to stand, but the suspect continued to resist by tensing his arms. The officer then executed a leg sweep, bringing the suspect to the ground, where he was successfully handcuffed. The suspect was found to be in possession of methamphetamine. No injuries.

Officers working at a large event were attempting to prevent unsupervised juveniles from entering the event. One of the juveniles began acting aggressively, yelling and pushing toward the officers while being restrained by other individuals. At one point, a juvenile approached the officer closely and was pushed back. The juvenile then charged towards the officer a second time and was subsequently OC sprayed. A separate juvenile attempted to charge at the officer in possession of the OC spray and was subsequently sprayed. Only one juvenile was taken into custody, as the other fled the scene. The detained juvenile was decontaminated and arrested for Aggravated Battery, Resisting Arrest, and Assault. No injuries.
