***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

An officer observed a vehicle in a store parking lot that had been reported stolen. Shortly after, officers observed an individual enter the vehicle and leave the parking lot. Due to the seriousness of the offense, a high-risk traffic stop was initiated. This type of stop requires officers to have their firearms ready or pointed toward the suspect to ensure safety and control of the situation. The individual was taken into custody without incident and subsequently charged with unlawful possession of a stolen motor vehicle. No injuries.

An officer responded to a report of a disturbance in the Brittany Estates neighborhood. Upon arrival, officers observed two males arguing in the front yard of a residence. While conducting an investigation, officers

attempted to detain both individuals and keep them separated. One of the subjects attempted to approach the other party, disregarding officer commands to stay back. Due to the subject's non-compliance, officers took him to the ground. The individual was then taken into custody for an active warrant and obstructing a peace officer. No injuries.

Officers conducted a traffic stop on a subject for a violation and discovered during the interaction the driver was intoxicated and had a suspended driver's license. When officers attempted to handcuff the individual, he pulled away and refused to place his hands behind his back. Officers then drew their Tasers and warned the subject of a potential deployment. The subject claimed to have a medical condition, and the Taser was not used. However, he continued to resist by holding onto the front bumper of the patrol vehicle. Officers again pointed their Tasers at the subject, who ultimately complied and was taken to the ground for handcuffing. The individual was arrested and charged with DUI, Resisting a Peace Officer, and Driving on a Suspended Driver's License. No injuries.

An officer observed a subject matching the description from a report of suspicious behavior and potential theft from a local retailer. The subject crossed a roadway intersection without using the designated crosswalk, causing an approaching vehicle to slow to avoid hitting her. The officer made contact, but the subject initially refused to provide identification. She eventually gave a name, which was later discovered to be false. When the officer attempted to place her under arrest, she refused to put her arms behind her back. She was handcuffed using necessary force but then resisted by refusing to walk to the patrol vehicle, going limp and deliberately falling to the ground. Officers had to carry her to the rear cage of the vehicle. She was charged with Obstructing Identification and Resisting a Peace Officer. No injuries.

Officers were notified of a traffic crash on Interstate 64. The vehicle involved was identified as the same one that had fled from Shiloh Police earlier that morning. A witness reported seeing two subjects flee into the nearby wood line after the crash. Officers discovered a box of ammunition in the front seat of the crashed vehicle. One of the subjects was located both visually and with the aid of a deployed drone. As a precaution, officers displayed their service firearms and available patrol rifles while taking the subject into custody. No injuries.

Officers responded to a local motel following reports of a possible sexual assault in progress. Additional information indicated threats had been made with a firearm, which had been discharged nearby. Officers approached the area cautiously, deploying their service pistols and patrol rifles. The subject was ordered out of their rented room and complied with officers' instructions. Further investigation revealed the victim had managed to escape before being forced to perform a sex act. A firearm was recovered at the scene and determined to be stolen. The subject was charged with Aggravated Discharge of a Firearm, Possession of a Stolen Firearm, and Attempted Criminal Sexual Assault.

An officer responded to the area following a report of an armed robbery. While canvassing the vicinity, the officer spotted an individual matching the description provided by the victim. The officer initiated a foot pursuit as the subject attempted to flee. Despite multiple commands to stop, the suspect refused to comply. The officer deployed his department-issued Taser, but it was ineffective. The subject ultimately escaped and could not be located.
