***A critical element of professional policing is ensuring the response to resistance we use is appropriate, legal, within policy, reviewed for improvement and enhanced training and supervised. Below is an abbreviated summary of the instances of our response to resistance to arrest:**

An officer responded to a report of a fight in progress in a residential area, with information indicating that one of the involved individuals was armed with a firearm. Upon arrival, the officer observed two vehicles leaving the scene at a high rate of speed, appearing to chase each other. This information was relayed via radio, and responding officers intercepted both vehicles. Due to the potential presence of a firearm and the nature of the situation, officers conducted a high-risk vehicle stop, displaying their firearms as a precautionary measure. The driver of the first vehicle was taken into custody, while the second vehicle was determined to be driven by the mother of the first driver. During the subsequent investigation, it was revealed the individual initially detained was actually the victim in the reported incident. He was immediately released from custody as the investigation

continued. The suspect, who had fled the scene prior to police arrival, remained at large, but charges were obtained based on the investigation.

Officers were contacted by a Missouri law enforcement agency regarding a subject residing at a local hotel who had active felony warrants for kidnapping, criminal sexual assault – sodomy and violence against law enforcement and was reportedly armed with a firearm. Officers responded to the area and identified a male matching the subject's description standing outside the hotel. When officers attempted to make contact, the subject fled into a nearby tree line. During the pursuit, the officer drew his department-issued firearm and issued clear verbal commands for the subject to stop. The subject ignored the commands and began walking backward before falling into a ravine. The officer then transitioned to his department-issued Taser and deployed it in an attempt to subdue the subject. The Taser deployment was ineffective, and the subject fled further into the wooded area. Drones were deployed to assist in locating the subject, who was eventually found hiding in the brush. The subject complied with commands to exit the brush, and officers, displaying their firearms and Tasers as a precaution, took him into custody without further resistance. A subsequent search of the area revealed a loaded firearm, which the subject had dropped in the ravine when he fell.

Officers received an alert regarding a stolen vehicle parked in the Lowe's parking lot. Upon locating the vehicle nearby, officers initiated a high-risk traffic stop to ensure the safety of all involved. This procedure involved the display of firearms as a precautionary measure to secure the vehicle's occupants. Following further investigation, it was determined the individual in the vehicle was the rightful owner. Officers promptly contacted the original reporting agency to clarify the situation and ensure their records were updated. Once the matter was resolved, the individual was released from custody without further incident.

Officers responded to a local hotel following a report of a male subject making an unauthorized entry into one of the rooms. Hotel employees reported the subject fled the premises when confronted. Officers conducted a search and located the individual on Ruby Lane. Upon making contact, the subject attempted to flee once again. In response, an officer deployed his department-issued Taser in a ready position while issuing clear verbal commands for the subject to stop. The display of the Taser, combined with the commands, prompted the individual to comply with the officers' instructions. He was subsequently taken into custody without further incident and charged with Criminal Trespass. The decision to display the Taser and issue verbal commands was based on the subject's repeated attempts to flee and the need to safely apprehend him while minimizing the risk of harm to all parties involved.
